# Your first 90 days out are

critical. Taking time now to map out your first days and months after your release will help determine whether you return to jail in the future.

Everyone has different needs, this guide is a basic summary of information and phone numbers/contacts for common services needed upon release from jail. If you have more specialized needs please discuss them with your case manager or probation officer.

## **EMPLOYMENT**

You will have financial obligations when you are released and you will need to plan for income.

The Jail has a partnership with CareerLink Lehigh Valley and they work hard to help people with a criminal record find employment. Please contact your case manager for more information. You may be eligible for the LEAP program while you are incarcerated.

If you have a serious persistent (not going away) medical or mental health diagnosis that limits your ability to work please contact your medical provider to ask whether disability (social security) could be an option for you.

## **HOUSING**

Having a home plan, (a place to live) is critical to parole. You will not be paroled without a valid home plan. If you were homeless at the time of booking, or your living situation has fallen apart since you have been in the jail notify your case manager. Staff at the jail can help you identify and apply for housing assistance.

If you are already in the community and you are homeless or fear you might become homeless here are some agencies you can contact:

## MENTAL HEALTH

If you have a history of mental health treatment in or out of jail it is important to set up services for ASAP after your release. The first few weeks after your release will be busy and probably stressful, do not forget to take care of yourself.

### **Setting Up Community Treatment**

- 1. Apply for medical assistance, do not wait until you are out to fill out a form, ask for a copy now and complete it while you are in jail.
- 2. Ask for assistance from the county mental health division. A Forensic Mental Health Worker will meet with you in the jail and will explain your options for treatment in the community. 610-829-4840
- 3. Ask what your current diagnosis is and for a list of your current medications that you can take with you when you leave.

- 1. Call 911 if you feel suicidal or homicidal.

# DRUG & ALCOHOL TREATMENT

If you have a history of substance abuse, you may need treatment, and at least an assessment for services. You can access this through the County's Drug and Alcohol Division. If an assessment is court ordered it can be conducted while you are inside the jail. If you are already out, contact the County's Drug and Alcohol Division 610-829-4725. To receive treatment in the community there are limited county funds to pay for services so you will need to apply for medical assistance, see your case manager for an application. Do not wait to get the application started.

If you are in the jail consider attending any **NA**, **AA** or "**Positive Change**" groups that are available on your housing unit.

## **EDUCATION**

If there is one thing you could do while you are incarcerated that would reduce your chances of returning it is to get your GED. Contact the Education Department for more information. If you started GED classes in the jail the NCC classes will be free to you- but there is a fee to take the GED test at NCC.
