

## AFFIDAVIT of PROBABLE CAUSE

Daniel Block is a Special Agent with the Bureau of Criminal Investigations of the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General and is currently assigned to the Child Predator Section. He has been investigating internet crimes against children since December of 2012 and is assigned to the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force. He has attended training courses that have focused on sexual offenses against children including computer based offenses. To date, he has actively participated in numerous investigations throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania dealing with online solicitations for sexual offenses and/or attempted sexual offenses with minors in addition to unlawful contact with minors, sexual abuse of children, and criminal use of communications facilities. Prior to the current position of Special Agent, your Affiant worked uniform patrol for the St. Louis County Police Department, St. Louis Missouri, additionally your Affiant worked as a Risk Management advisor for Convoy of Hope. Your Affiant has conducted international criminal investigations, including kidnappings, and crimes of violence against children.

Kathleen Fallon is a Special Agent with the Bureau of Criminal Investigations of the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General and is currently assigned to the Child Predator Section. She is assigned to the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force. The task force is responsible for conducting undercover online investigations, responding to complaints regarding children sexually exploited via the Internet, conducting community education programs and monitoring of the Internet for the bartering in child pornography. Your Affiant has been investigating internet crimes against children since May of 2017. Your Affiant has been employed as a Special Agent with the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General since 2015. Prior to the current position of Special Agent, you Affiant worked for the Virginia Beach Police Department as a patrol officer for 3 years, employed as a Municipal Police Officer within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, from 2007 through 2012 and was also employed as a Deputy Sheriff in Lackawanna County Pennsylvania from 2007 through 2012.



**AFFIDAVIT of PROBABLE CAUSE CONTINUATION**

On October 2, 2017, at approximately 10:15am, your Affiants were investigating alleged unlawful contact of a child, at Behavioral Health Associates, 50 Meadow Avenue, Tamaqua, Schuylkill County, PA 18252. Affiants would note that Behavioral Health Associates is a private academic school licensed through the Pennsylvania Department of Education. It provides alternative education placements for students in a non-traditional school setting.

While there, we spoke with the Director of Education who suggested we speak with a teacher by the name of Jordan M. Beggan (hereinafter Beggan), in reference to this investigation.

Your Affiants contacted Beggan (in a school office). Your Affiants informed Beggan that he was not under arrest, was free to leave, and could stop the interview at any time. Beggan stated he understood, wanted to help and wished to speak with us.

Beggan stated he has been working at Behavioral Health Associates, as an Instructional Assistant, since November of 2015. Beggan stated he initially met child victim#1 (who was also a student at the aforementioned school) prior to starting work at Behavioral Health Associates, and would see him at various parties and social events. Beggan stated that he and child victim#1 were Facebook friends but that ended a while ago. Beggan stated that recently they used Snapchat to communicate. When Beggan began working at the school, child victim#1 was still a student there. While at the school, Beggan would have direct contact with the child victim in his capacity as an Instructional Assistant.

Beggan stated that he and child victim#1 would go for "drives and talk."

Beggan stated that in the spring of 2016, child victim#1 would call him and Beggan would go pick him up for a ride in his car. During this time frame, Beggan would have been 24 years of age and child victim#1 was 16 years of age. Beggan stated he would buy beer and talk with child victim#1. Beggan also stated that he shared the beer with child victim#1. Beggan stated the "car rides" started to happen a lot, stating he had more than "10 separate car rides" with child victim#1. It should be noted, Beggan would pick up child victim#1 in Tamaqua PA, and drive around the Tamaqua area and/or surrounding parts of Schuylkill County, PA. Beggan stated that on these rides, it would usually be late in the day and dark. They would go buy beer, then drive to a rural location to "talk." Beggan stated on two of these occasions he put his (Beggan's) hand on child victim#1's leg. Beggan stated he kept moving his hand up child victim#1's leg until his hand was touching child victim#1's penis over the minor's clothing. Beggan stated he kept his hand on child victim#1's penis for approximately a minute. Beggan stated that after both experiences he felt bad and told child victim#1 that he was sorry.

**AFFIDAVIT of PROBABLE CAUSE CONTINUATION**

Beggan started crying during the interview. He stated for the last year or so, he had hooked up with four or five younger guys, utilizing an app called Grindr. He stated that no one knew he was gay. He had not told his fiancé, family or any friends. He stated he had always struggled with coming to terms with being gay and did not want to tell anyone.

Your Affiants spoke with child victim#1 (DOB 7/29/1999). Child victim#1 stated that he met Beggan while out at various parties and social events in late 2015. Child victim#1 stated that once Beggan began to work as a teacher at his school, they became "closer." He would call Beggan if things were not going well. He stated Beggan would offer to take him for a car ride "to talk about it." Child victim#1 stated during these car rides, Beggan would buy him beer, and drive somewhere out of town. Child victim#1 indicated that Beggan would be present while the minor consumed the beer purchased by Beggan. Child victim#1 stated that on two occasions while on these car rides, Beggan touched his penis. He stated Beggan would put his hand on his (child victim#1's) leg then would run his hand up his leg and touch his penis over his clothing. Child victim#1 stated that Beggan touched his penis for about a minute or so each time. Child victim#1 stated that this made him feel uncomfortable, but he did not know how to react. Child victim#1 stated that afterwards, Beggan felt bad and sent him a text apologizing a few days later.

Based upon the aforementioned facts, your Affiant respectfully request an arrest warrant be issued for the Defendant Jordan M. Beggan.
