Intern Roles/Responsibilities:

- Create and maintain spreadsheets containing training data for every agent in the OAG;
- Receive, organize, and post training documents from trainers across the Commonwealth;
- Complete OST forms to initialize outside training;
- Monitor the movement of new agents through a training matrix;
- Complete weekly reports for the Director on training documents received and those past due;
- Research vendors and venues for training, as directed by the Director;
- Accompany the Director on region visits, inspections, and audits;
- Additional duties as assigned.

- Must be highly organized and able to work independently;
- Experience with spreadsheets and digital files preferred;
- Strong preference will be given to students with interest in law enforcement/criminal justice;
