As this Act provides for utilization of the forfeiture provisions by both the Attorney General and the District Attorneys of the counties in the Commonwealth, this report contains information on property forfeited to the Commonwealth through the efforts of the Office of Attorney General as well as the efforts of the District Attorneys of the Commonwealth.

This Annual Report is submitted to the Appropriations and Judiciary Committees of the Senate and the Appropriations and Judiciary Committees of the House of Representatives to provide the Legislature with an accounting of the property forfeited under the provisions of the Controlled Substances Forfeitures Act, an Act of June 30, 1988, Act No. 1988-79, 42 Pa. C.S.A. Section 6801 et seq. Section 6801(j) of the Controlled Substances Forfeitures Act provides that the Attorney General shall annually submit a report specifying the forfeited property or proceeds thereof obtained under this section. The report shall give an accounting of all proceeds derived from the sale of forfeited property and the use made of unsold forfeited property.

ALLEGHENY

Vehicles are being used by local police and undercover task force agents for undercover drug investigations. Jewelry will go to auction and the proceeds will be deposited into the asset forfeiture fund account. Fagers and portable telephones will be used by local and State Police and/or task force agents for undercover drug investigations and/or will go to auction.

BEAVER

Three (3) automobiles to be used by Beaver County Drug Task Force. Ten (10) weapons assigned for use by the Beaver County Drug Task Force.

BEDFORD

One (1) vehicle sold and proceeds placed in District Attorney's drug enforcement account.

BERKS

After final orders are issued on forfeited property, the items are dispensed to county detectives and local law enforcement officials for their use in the apprehension and conviction of drug offenders. The District Attorney's Office maintains a list of the items dispensed and to whom they are given.

BUTLER

Three (3) vehicles turned over to local police departments for their use. One (1) vehicle returned to defendant as an informant fee. One (1) vehicle retained by District Attorney for surveillance operations. One (1) weapon retained by District Attorney and one (1) weapon disposition pending completion of criminal case. No weapons destroyed during period of audit.

CAMBRIA

One (1) vehicle is to be used for surveillance by District Attorney's Office and police department.

CARBON One (1) vehicle is to be used exclusively by the Carbon County Drug Task Force for drug enforcement.

CENTRE One (1) vehicle is being used in drug investigations and one (1) vehicle awaiting sale.

CHESTER Three (3) vehicles are being used by law enforcement personnel for drug work.

CLEARFIELD One (1) vehicle is used for drug investigation and surveillance. Vehicle is titled in county name.

DAUPHIN If vehicles are not sold at auction, they are used by Harrisburg Police Department, Dauphin County Drug Task Force or Dauphin County Adult Probation.

DELAWARE Three (3) vehicles given to C.I.D. for surveillance purposes. Sixteen (16) vehicles were sold and proceeds put into drug fund. Eleven (11) vehicles awaiting auction.

ERIE Four (4) vehicles seized were used in further investigations and one (1) vehicle was sold.

FAYETTE One (1) set of Ohaus scales were destroyed.

FRANKLIN One (1) vehicle titled to Franklin County Task Force for use as undercover vehicle. One vehicle titled to Franklin County Task Force pending as of ending date of audit period.

GREENE Boat and trailer and real estate pending sale.

LACKAWANNA One (1) vehicle is used in undercover drug investigations and two (2) vehicles not being used.

LANCASTER Several vehicles to be sold; remaining items to be utilized in drug investigations.

LEBANON Two (2) motor vehicles were sold. One (1) motor vehicle was put in use by the Drug Task Force, County Detective Bureau. One (1) motor vehicle will be put to use by the Drug Task Force, County Detective Bureau, and eleven (11) motor vehicles to be sold at auction.

LEHIGH Fourteen (14) vehicles and ten (10) pagers used by local police officers for enforcement of the Controlled Substance Act. Drugs, drug paraphernalia, drug records, one (1) safe and one (1) calculator

destroyed. Remaining items neither used nor disposed of. One (1) vehicle, one (1) camera, one (1) monitor and two (2) telephone line testers given to Pennsylvania State Police, Troop "M", Vice Unit, and used for law enforcement of the Controlled Substance Act. Drugs, drug paraphernalia and drug records destroyed. Remaining forfeited items neither used nor disposed of. All forfeited weapons and ammunition destroyed.

LYCOMING

Three (3) vehicles sold at an advertised public sale.

MIFFLIN

One (1) vehicle used by task force for surveillance.

MONTGOMERY

Used by Montgomery County Narcotics Enforcement Team; Five (5) vehicles sold at public auction, One (1) residential property sold at public auction, Silver ingots and bearer bonds sold at market value, Seven (7) vehicles utilized by local police and one (1) vehicle junked. Weapons pending destruction until after criminal prosecution is completed and evidentiary value expires.

MONTOUR

One (1) vehicle used by county detective on District Attorney's staff for ongoing drug investigations and enforcement.

All vehicles stored on county property.

YORK

Sixteen (16) vehicles sold, twelve (12) available for sale. Eight (8) vehicles used by Drug Abuse Strike Force. Diamond sold, two (2) cellular phones sold, one stolen. Four (4) Motorola pagers in use by Drug Abuse Strike Force. Mobile Home sold. One (1) vehicle to be sold, pending change of title.
