I am writing to you to update you as to where we are at with our walk-in cooler case. The Upper Tulpehocken Township has decided to appeal the Appeals board decision, and now are taking me to civil court. Numerous people from different agencies and departments have told me to reach out to you again and submit the Upper Tulpehocken Township Building Zoning Appeals board decision. I've attached the decision to this email.

Please pay particular attention to The Conclusions of Law page.

Item #4 states.... Where there is a conflict in the Act and Code, the Act applies.

Item #12 states... The Code Official for the Township incorrectly interpreted or applied the Act and Code.

Item #31 states .... The Act and Code provide for an exception to the requirements for construction of agricultural buildings:

After these findings and the conclusion was executed, the solicitor met with the three township officials. They voted unanimously to appeal the appeals board decision.

I've been served papers that the Upper Tulpehocken Township Building Board of Appeals decision granting me ability to build my walk-in cooler, is now being appealed by the Board of Supervisors of Upper Tulpehocken Township. The court of Common Pleas of Berks County, PA will be the location of this civil action by the local agency appeal.

Since then,

I've been in contact with the Right to Farm Act. I make over \$10,000 a year and have less than 10 acres. He is interested in including our property in Preserved Farmland. I have a follow up meeting with him in the coming days.

I am a member of Berks County Farm Bureau. I attended a meeting with the county and some state board members. They were a great resource of information. They gave me three lawyers to contact and suggested I reach out to you to update you on the appeals board decision.

I am interested in having you review my case again based on the appeals board decision that I have attached.
