Justification:

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The PA Office of Attorney General's, Insurance Fraud Section (IFS) is the largest law enforcement entity within Pennsylvania that has authority to investigate and prosecute insurance fraud. The IFS receives over 3,000 referrals a year and currently has 500 cases with open insurance fraud investigations. There has been focus, over the last several years, to investigate and prosecute larger, complex and organized cases involving

millions of dollars. Additionally, there has been an active approach taken in using wires, Grand Jury and undercover investigations to complete tasks. Therefore, the need for additional tools (beyond the free version provided by the National Insurance Crime Bureau - NICB) to accelerate and aid in processing investigations.

The AFI-Gov product includes advanced technology that contains a repository for insurance claims information on a national level. The addition of this technology, to the existing no-cost version provided by the NICB, will allow IFS to streamline referral data as well as pre-set and arrange cases to be opened and assigned more effectively throughout the state. In addition, there are often cases throughout the agency in other sections (i.e. Medicaid Fraud, etc.) that contain insurance fraud elements, which would benefit from this technology and would allow collaboration within the OAG. Likewise, it is known that fraud schemes are not confined to state lines. Therefore, this technology would allow the OAG's IFS to assist and participate with insurance fraud cases amongst states and throughout the nation.
